



Rules on granting scholarships and incentives to EEU students




Approved by the order №. 05/01-01 of February 10, 2026 of the Rector of the University

Article 1. General Provisions

1. The "Rules on Granting Scholarships and Incentives to Students" (hereinafter referred to as the "Rule") regulates the procedures for defining and issuing scholarships and other incentives for students of East European University LLC.
2. The purpose of this rule is to increase student motivation, create a competitive environment, improve and promote student life.

Article 2. Types of Scholarships and Incentives

1. The University has:
 - a) University scholarships for undergraduate, integrated and postgraduate students;
 - b) Study grant;
 - c) One-time awards and other types of individual incentives;
2. The student will receive a university scholarship based on the results achieved each Academic Year. The scholarship is valid for one Academic Year and is defined in the amount of 600 (six hundred) GEL;
3. The training grant applies to the following target groups:
 - a) Socially vulnerable persons;
 - b) Foreign citizens of Georgian ethnic origin (Laz, Georgians from Fereydun, etc.);
 - c) Persons affected by natural disasters;
 - d) Honorary graduates (bachelor's students holding a gold or silver medal for outstanding academic achievement in secondary education)
 - e) Other separate cases by the decision of the Rector;
4. The study grant for distinguished secondary school graduates is allocated as follows:
 - a) Gold medal holders – 20% tuition fee coverage;
 - b) Silver medal holders – 10% tuition fee coverage.
5. The student will be awarded a one-time prize for outstanding activity in university life (for example, representing the University in sports, cultural, intellectual competitions, exhibitions, scientific conferences, etc.).



6. The Rector of the University, on his / her own initiative or at the request of the faculty, student self-government, carries out various types of individual incentive activities that serve to improve student life and increase motivation;

Article 3. Scholarship Appointment Procedure and Assessment Criteria

1. Students are funded by the **University Scholarship** on the basis of the student's academic performance, active participation in student university activities and involvement in educational-scientific activities;
2. University scholarship is not granted:
 - a) In case of termination of student's status or award of an academic degree in the scholarship year;
 - b) For a student who moved with mobility in the spring / autumn semester of the previous academic year;
 - c) For an additional semester student;
 - d) For a student who has registered less credits than the number of credits defined by the educational program per Academic Year;
3. Academic attendance is calculated in the number of courses registered by the student during the previous Academic Year at the University according the weighted of grade point average (GPA).
4. Students with an Academic Year **GPA** (grade point average) of **3.5 or higher** are eligible for the University Scholarship, according the 1st and 2nd Subsections of this Article; **The minimum grade** obtained in student East European university activities **is not less than 6 points**; **The minimum grade** for participation in educational-scientific activities **is not less than 2 points**.
5. The activity that will be carried out after the end of the academic year and before the beginning of the new academic year, the student will be considered as participating in the activity carried out in the previous academic year.

6. The priority list of university and academic-scientific student activities and the corresponding points for the award of a university scholarship are set out in Annex No. 1 to these Rule.
7. Each academic year registration of students in university and educational-scientific student activities is carried out by the relevant faculty. The Faculty shall establish a list of University Scholars, which shall be considered by the Department of Education in accordance with the criteria set forth in Article 3, paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of this Rule. The final list of scholarship holders is approved by the order of the Rector.
8. A **study grant** for the educational programs of the University may be obtained by a member of each group referred to in subparagraph „a”, b, c, e of paragraph 3 of Article 2 after applying to the Rector of the University and submitting the relevant documentation. The amount of the study grant is determined on a case-by-case basis, on the basis of a recommendation from the Dean of the Faculty, by order of the Rector;
9. Students who completed their **general secondary education with a gold or silver medal must**, in order to receive the Distinguished School Graduates' Study Grant, submit a certificate issued by the competent authority confirming graduation with distinction (gold or silver medal) within the registration period set by the Rector's order for first-year enrollment.
10. The Faculty shall determine the list of recipients of the Distinguished School Graduates' Study Grant and, in agreement with the Education Department, submit it to the Rector.
11. By order of the Rector, scholarships will be awarded to graduate students with honors for the duration of the program if they continuously maintain have a GPA of 3.0 or higher each semester.
12. A **one-time award** is given to a student for outstanding activity in university life (for example, representing the University in sporting, cultural, intellectual competitions, exhibitions, scientific conferences, etc.) and the Rector of the University, according

the recommendation of the Student Self-Government President or the Faculty, determines the the recipient of the onetime award and the type of award.

Article 4. Final Provisions

1. Approval, amendment, and repeal of these Rule shall be effected by an order of the Rector of the University.

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| Pouint | Participation in University Student Activities Implemented by East European University (minimum threshold – 6 points) |
| 1 | Participation in training courses and certificate programs |
| 0,5 | Participation in public lectures, seminars, debates, workshops, and similar educational or cultural-sports activities |
| 1 | Participation in competitions, Olympiads, and similar intellectual events |
| 1 | Participation in social and corporate social responsibility-oriented activities (charitable, environmental, and other activities) |
| 1 | Membership in student clubs, associations, and cultural or sports teams |

| 1 | Participation in a scientific conference or scientific-practical workshop as a presenter |
| 1 | Participation in seasonal schools, exchange projects, simulated processes/models, and related activities organized by the University, as well as exhibition of works |
| 1 | Publication of a scientific article in an academic journal |
| 1 | Winning student grant-funded scientific research projects |
| 0,5 | Membership in the Organizing Committee of a conference organized by East European University |
